

Important Instructions Regarding the Registration Process for AIBE-XIX as per Revised Guidelines

Dear Candidates,

This notification provides critical instructions for the registration process for the All India Bar Examination (AIBE-XIX). It is particularly aimed at the following categories of candidates:

- * Final Semester Law Students (3-year or 5-year LL.B) without backlogs
- * Law Graduates who have completed their LL.B but have not obtained their degree or not enrolled with any State Bar Council.
- * Law Graduates who have obtained their degree but surrendered their enrollment certificates due to employment.

Important Emphasis on BCI Recognition:

Candidates must ensure they are studying at or have graduated from a Bar Council of India (BCI)-recognised university or BCI-approved college. These colleges must be affiliated with a BCI-recognised university. Failure to meet this criterion will result in ineligibility for appearing in the AIBE-XIX.

Instructions:

1. Registration Form:

The link for filling out the registration form remains the same for all candidates. Please ensure that you meet the eligibility criteria outlined below.

Final Year, Final Semester Students

I am a final-year, final-semester law student with only my final semester exams remaining, and I have no backlogs from previous semesters. I confirm that my institution is a BCI-recognised university or a BCI-approved college affiliated with a BCI-recognised university.

- Candidates Awaiting Final Results

I have completed my final semester exams, have no backlogs, and am awaiting my final results. I confirm that my institution is a BCI-recognised university or a BCI-approved college affiliated with a BCI-recognised university.

- Law Graduates Without Enrollment

I am a law graduate who has not yet enrolled with a State Bar Council. I have/have not obtained my LL.B degree (strike-off, whichever is not applicable). I confirm that my institution is a BCI-recognised university or a BCI-approved college affiliated with a BCI-recognised university.

Law Graduates Employed Without Enrollment

I am a law graduate who is currently employed in

(mention job/service) and have either not enrolled or surrendered my enrollment due to my employment. I understand that if I sit for the AIBE and pass, I will be eligible for enrollment for a period of six months subject to my resigning from my job. I further understand that after this six-month period, I will be required to reappear for the AIBE if I wish to continue practicing law. I confirm that my institution is a BCI-recognised university or a BCI-approved college affiliated with a BCI-recognised university.

* It is mandatory that all candidates ensure their university or college is BCI-recognised or BCI-approved and affiliated with a BCI-recognised university. The Bar Council of India strictly enforces this eligibility requirement, and non-compliance will lead to the rejection of your application.

2. Undertaking Submission:

Candidates who are not yet enrolled with a State Bar Council but have obtained their law degree, or are in the final semester of their LL.B. degree with no backlogs, or law graduates who are employed and have surrendered their enrollment certificate must submit an undertaking.

Download the Undertaking

You can download the undertaking form from the AIBE website or find it on the last page of the application form.

Upload the Undertaking

After completing the undertaking, you must upload a scanned copy (not a mobile photo) of the signed document.

Note: Candidates who are already enrolled and have an enrollment certificate must upload their self-attested enrollment certificate. The undertaking form is only for candidates who do not possess an

enrollment certificate or are in the final semester of their LL.B course without backlogs.

3. Document Submission (Marksheets of LL.B):

Final Semester Candidates

If you are in the final semester of your 3-year or 5-year integrated LL.B. degree course, you must attach self-attested, scanned copies (not photos) of your marksheet for each semester. It is essential that your college or university is BCI-recognised or BCI-approved and affiliated with a BCI-recognised university.

- For 3-year LL.B. degree course candidates, submit marksheets from Semester-I to Semester-V.
- For 5-year integrated LL.B. degree course candidates, submit marksheets from Semester-I to Semester-IX.

Law Graduates Without Degree

If you have passed your LL.B. degree course but have not yet obtained your law degree, you must attach self-attested, scanned copies (not photos) of all your marksheets. Ensure your college is BCI-approved and affiliated with a BCI-recognised university.

- For 3-year LL.B. degree course candidates, submit marksheets from Semester-I to Semester-VI.
- For 5-year integrated LL.B. degree course candidates, submit marksheets from Semester-I to Semester-X.

Important Reminder on BCI Recognition:

* Only candidates from BCI-recognised universities or BCI-approved colleges affiliated with BCI-recognised universities are eligible to register for AIBE-XIX.

* It is the responsibility of every candidate to verify their institution's status with the Bar Council of India. Non-compliance with this rule will result in automatic disqualification from the exam.

* If you are uncertain about your university or college's status, it is highly recommended that you contact the Bar Council of India or verify the institution's recognition before submitting your registration.
